Antlers completes work on \$2M pool

VAIL — The Antlers at Vail has completed its \$2 million swimming pool redevelopment project, General Manager Rob LeVine said.

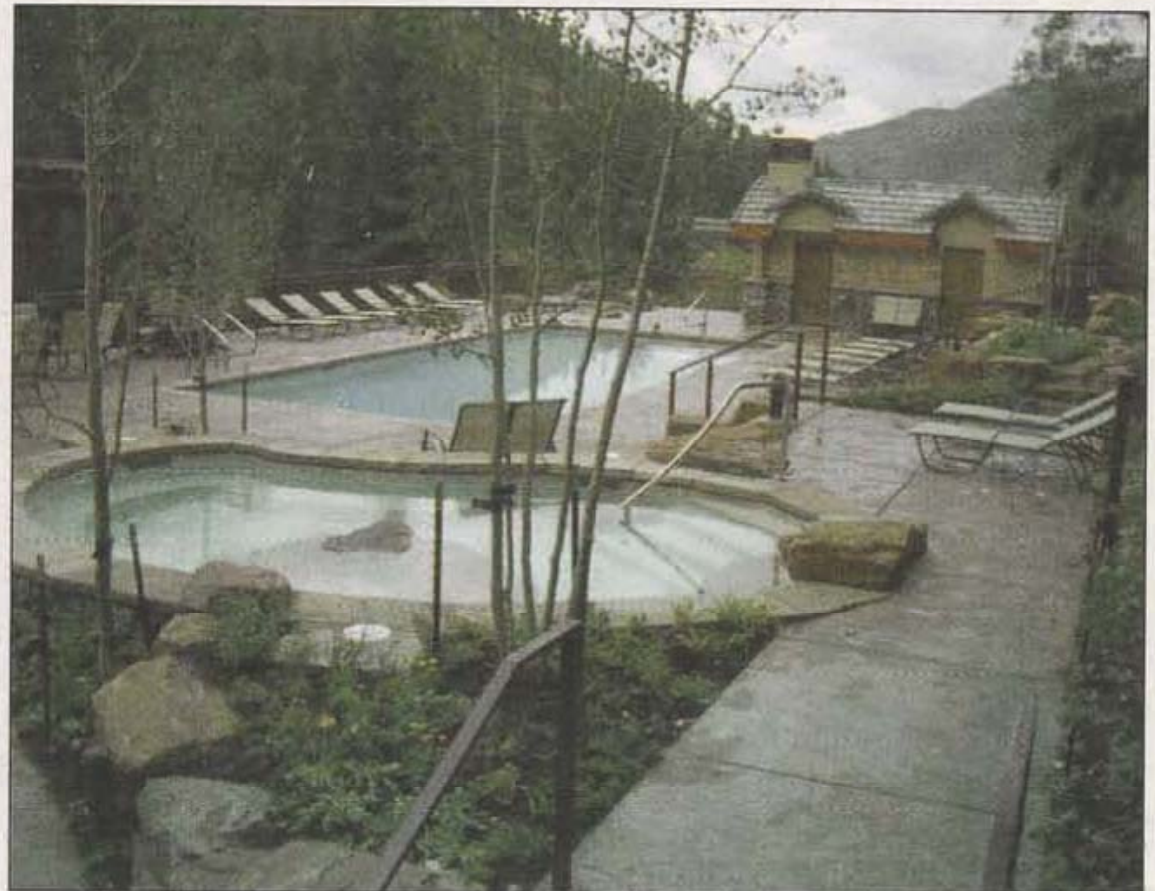
The project included demolition of the old pool and installation of a new swimming pool, two hot tubs, changing rooms with lavatories, new retaining walls and landscaping.

Many of the improvements — like the new rock retaining walls and landscaping done by Vail's Land Designs by Ellison — can be seen from the nearby bike path.

"The only thing left to do on this project is have the celebration luau," LeVine said. "The Antlers at Vail homeowners have tested it out, and the pool has received great reviews."

In 2003, the Antlers at Vail completed the first phase of a \$20 million redevelopment plan that included 22 new condo/lodging units — the first new units built in Lionshead in 20 years — plus a new lobby, conference center, business center, fitness room and board room. The pool project was the second phase of the redevelopment plan.

The Antlers at Vail redevelopment was the first in a series of projects aimed at reinvigorating the Lionshead area. Vail Resorts has unveiled a \$400 million plan to update the village with a "European-style" pedestrian-oriented mall, in addition to two more hotels, single-family homes, ground-floor shops and expanded parking.
